



Webs of Justice, is a declaration of FutureEverything's responsibilities to Nature, that frames our Nature Directed commitment, and our creative vision.

The declaration is our guide for centering just relations with technology. It is a response to the urgent need to shift techno-scientific imagination beyond extractive and abstractive logics and instead support the flourishing of people and planet by foregrounding reconnection and repair.

WEBS of JUSTICE

1) Responsibility to attune to, recognise and honour our intra-relations with our more-than-human kin past, present and future. To be accountable to the Web of Life we collectively comprise.

2) Responsibility to ensure that no humans are marginalized, or further marginalized, as we work towards the mutual flourishing of the more-than-human.

3) Responsibility to acknowledge the "postnatural" hybridity of life today (e.g. our scientific and technological entanglements) in order to find new pathways towards multispecies flourishing.

4) Responsibility to recognise and honour the absolute interdependence of technologies on Nature - human or otherwise. To be cognisant of the intersections between environmental, multispecies and technology justice.

5) Responsibility to release, imagine and prototype technological futures that de-prioritise market logics.

6) Responsibility to practice the "honourable harvest" throughout the lifespan of technologies and technological infrastructure - from fabrication, to use, distribution and recycling.

7) Responsibility to prioritise technologies - ancient or contemporary - that support the healing and regeneration of damaged ecologies, to be good ancestors to past, present and future generations.

8) Responsibility to respect Nature's inherent mystery, and prerogative to resist translation and "decoding".

9) Responsibility to foreground the local and ancestral meanings that form the social, cultural and spiritual glue with beings & places when using technologies to mediate ecological relations.
